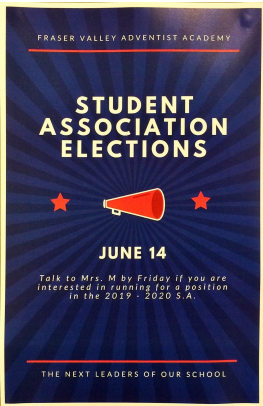

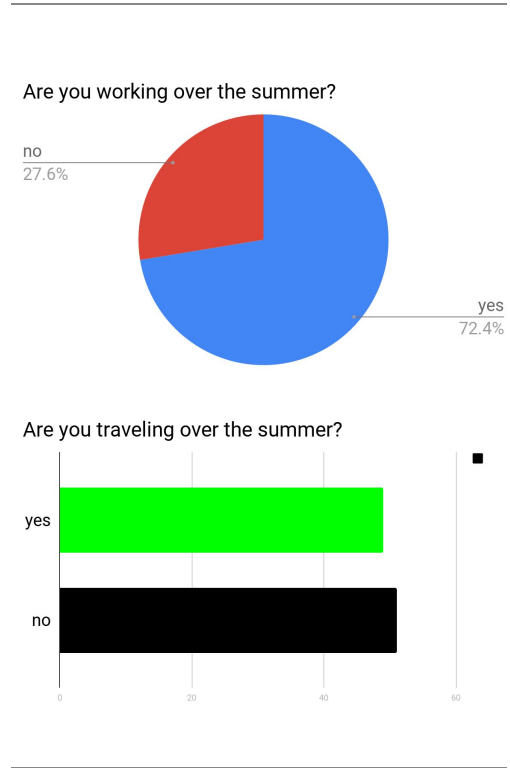
HS Spring Concert
